Rest of the World Cup: All countries, excluding the Africa continent, are included in the exhibition range for this cup. Minimum two frames (32 pages) exhibit – as for a classical collection.

# FORERUNNER POSTAL HISTORY OF BASUTOLAND

[Summary of exhibit with information and scans provided by exhibitor]

Mashesh created the Basuto Nation between 1820 - 30. The first whites to settle in Basutoland were the missionaries from the Paris Evangelical Missionary Society at Morija in 1833. The posts were originally serviced through Graaff-Reinet in the Cape Colony, but later via Aliwal North in 1858. The missionaries had a profound influence on the development of the postal system in Basutoland and this is reflected in examples of their correspondence.

Cape of Good Hope stamps were used in Basutoland until 1910, when the Union stamps were valid postage through to 1st December 1933. The interprovincial period was from 18th September 1910 to 1st September 1913, where stamps from the four provinces were valid postage.

Some unique items include:

1878 - Only recorded usage of Maseru to Morija cover bearing a 4d Cape rectangular cancelled by a dumb

cancel (type K1).



On Active Service

1881 Incoming to Mafeteng - one of only four recorded in-going soldiers' covers

A cover addressed to Capt Geo Green of the Kat River Levies in Mafeteng. The cover was sent unfranked from Queenstown with a cancellation of FE 5 81. It appears as if the force moved on as there is a transit cancel of King Williams Town, MR 19, before it was endorsed "Maseru" and was sent back to Basutoland, via Aliwal North, where a 3d Cape stamp was affixed and cancelled MR 23. Again they were not able to trace Capt Green as the cover then sent back to Queenstown with a transit of AP 14, before going to Balfour with an arrival dated AP 20 1881.




Griqualand West used in Basutoland

1886 & 1895 - these have not been reported before



Maseru similar type D2 but nicks in frame, SP 2, 1886. With a genuine Griqualand overprint This is a new discovery



Maseru type D2 used in 1895 With a forged G.W. overprint. It is a genuine cancel.

The theory of these type of usages is three fold:

- Firstly, there could have been a shortage of normal CoGH issues at Basutoland offices. The postal authorities may have sourced issues from surrounding territories.
- Secondly, there was a steady movement of traders in Basutoland. The traders could have brought "orders" of stamps from other post offices they had passed through due to the shortages.
- Thirdly, missionaries were used to experiencing shortages of postage stamps in Basutoland and carried their own stocks which they sourced from travels in surrounding territories.

1887 - Secord recorded example of Cape card with a single circle Morija used on MR 5, 18878 (type K2) used in combination with an indistinct nine-barred oval numeral canceller no 277 (type K1).



A registered stationery envelope with the 210 barred oval numeral (type K1) and a circular Mohaleshoek cancel (type D2) dated 17 NO 1897.

This is believed to be the only recorded example.



Boer War Cogwheel - OV/Censor/s Cachet (1900) Boer War censored at Leribe - less than 10 examples recorded

This morning front with a cogwheel cancel was addressed to H.F. Serfontein, POW, Green Point Camp, Cape Colony. The cover was censored at the place of posting. POW's were receiving post from Basutoland which was Cape Administration. The post from Basutoland was censored by a Magistrate at the town where it was posted, hence no Official censor cachets are found. The OVS censor cachet was only applied to Basutoland mail destined for Cape Town by a specifically appointed censor. Details of this still have to be discovered. Theory has it that Leribe could the office of origination.



1933 Maseru - Transvaal plate flaw on cover

A cover posted from Maseru cancelled with type D16 dated 30 DEC 33. The registered cachet is type R5 dated 30 DEC 33. There is a Pretoria arrival cancel dated 2 JAN 34. It is noted that this cover is philatelic. However, this is believed to be the only example of the usage of the "inverted P" (row 10/6) on both stamps used to Pretoria.
